FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Financial Management: The organization adheres to a policy of full transparency in all financial operations. A robust computerized accounting system is in place, utilizing Tally software for precise and efficient bookkeeping. To ensure accurate financial oversight, a monthly financial statement is generated, providing a clear view of the financial status of each project. Daily maintenance of all financial records, including cashbooks and ledgers, is rigorously followed. Separate books of accounts are maintained for each project to ensure clear and distinct financial tracking. All accounts are subject to regular audits conducted by an external auditor to ensure compliance and accuracy. The organization operates bank accounts with a nationalized bank, and additional accounts are opened as required to meet specific project needs. Periodic financial reports are generated through the MIS system and submitted to the respective project sanctioning authorities, ensuring adherence to guidelines and facilitating effective financial monitoring and control.

RAPPORT & LIAISON

The organization maintains strong relationships and effective liaison with various government departments at all levels, ensuring their continued support in the successful implementation of programs. It has also fostered positive, ongoing partnerships with all funding agencies, including those that have provided support in the past and those involved in current initiatives. Additionally, annual accounts are audited by a Chartered Accountant and subsequently published for the information of all stakeholders, reinforcing the organization's commitment to accountability and transparency.

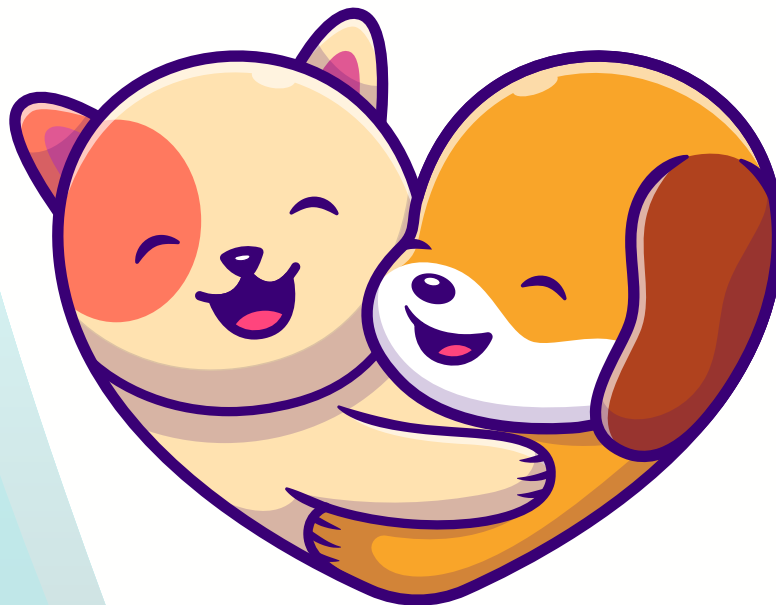

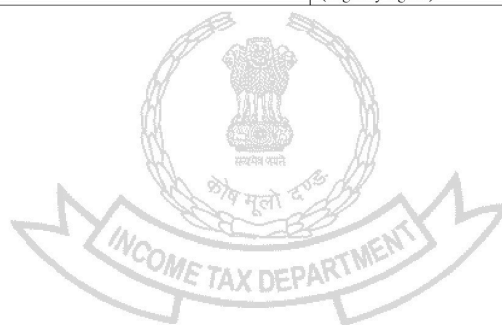
