

Separate books of accounts are maintained for each project to ensure clear and distinct financial tracking. All accounts are subject to regular audits conducted by an external auditor to ensure compliance and accuracy. The organization operates bank accounts with a nationalized bank, and additional accounts are opened as required to meet specific project needs. Periodic financial reports are generated through the MIS system and submitted to the respective project sanctioning authorities, ensuring adherence to guidelines and facilitating effective financial monitoring and control.




POOR CHILDREN HELP CAMPS
